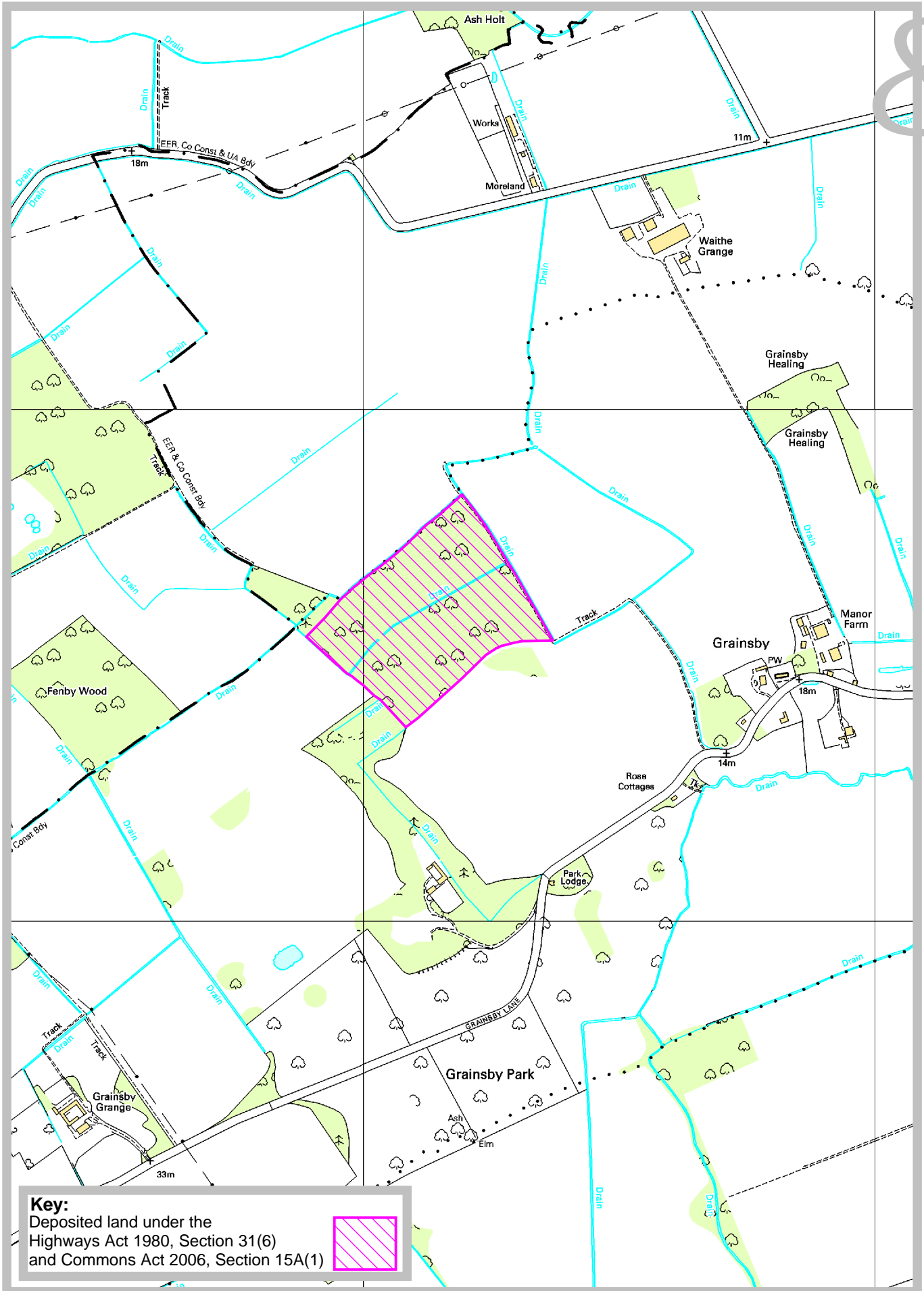
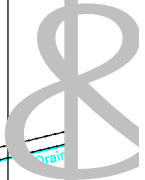

REGISTER OF DEPOSITS

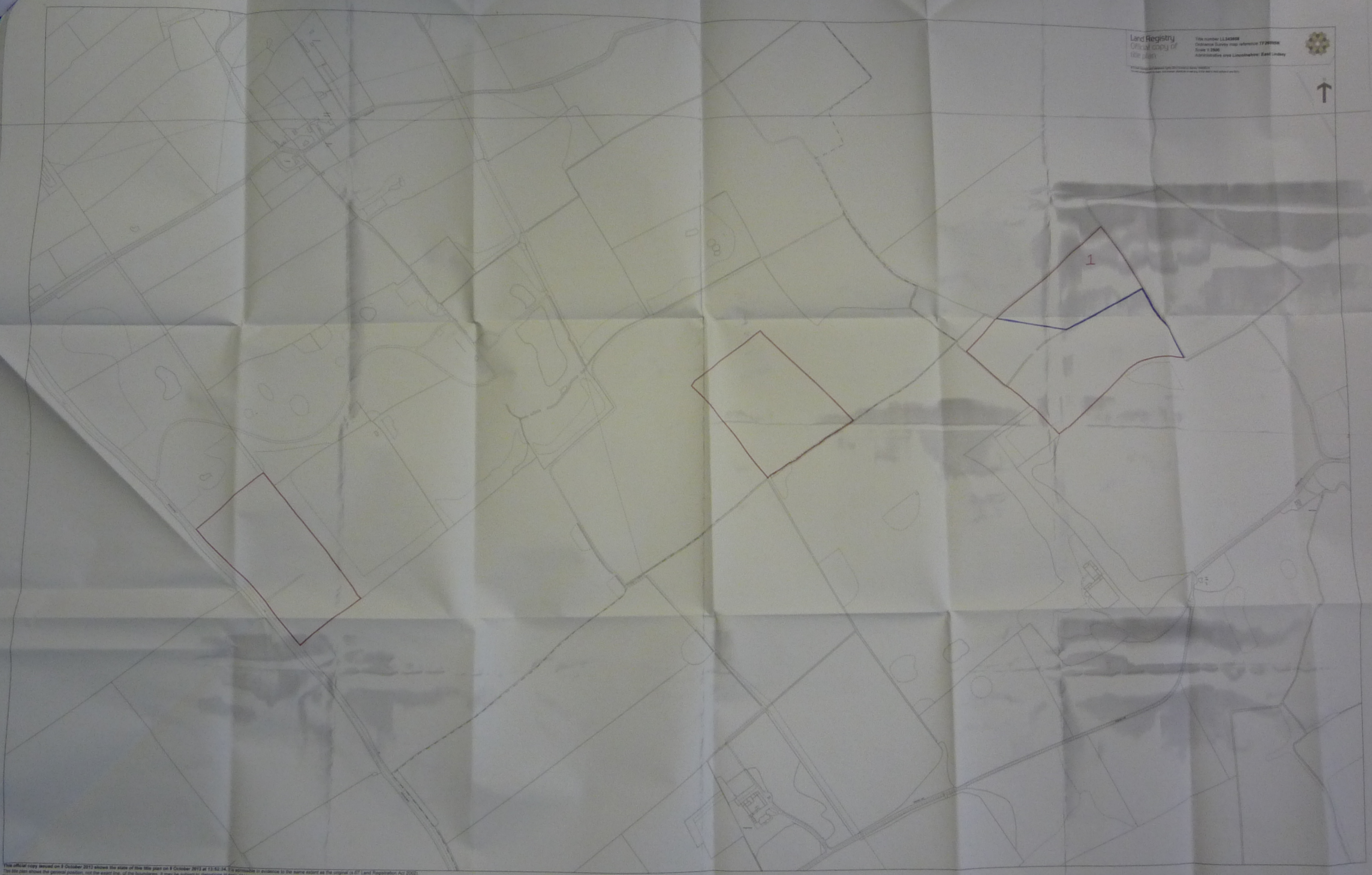
