LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (CHAPEL ST LEONARDS – SEA BANK ROAD) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AMENDMENT ORDER 20

STATEMENT OF REASONS

- Lincolnshire County Council received a request to review the waiting restrictions on Sea Bank Road, Chapel St Leonards.
- The review highlighted that the current waiting restriction of 10am 7pm,
 May 30 September is no longer appropriate and therefore the following restrictions are being proposed: -
 - The existing bays on The Green will become 1 hour limited waiting 8am 6pm, No return within 1 hour
 - Introduce 1 hour limited waiting 8am 6pm, No return within 1 hour on The Esplande between Detree's and Choyce Carpets.
 - No Waiting at Any Time to replace the existing seasonal restrictions on The Green, The Esplande, Ancaster Avenue, South Road, Sea Road and Sea Bank Road. Some seasonal restrictions will remain on Sea Bank Road
- The existing restrictions will be amended to allow customers to have a more realistic time frame in which to use the local businesses on The Green.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Councils Policy, it is proposed to amend the existing restrictions as shown in the consultation plans.
- The Chief Constable, Chapel Parish Council and East Lindsey District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.
