- Mercer Row Reduction of existing loading bay. Introduction of police bay in vicinity of numbers 32-34. No Waiting or Loading in vicinity of numbers 17-33

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks after 14 March 2022 make application to the High Court for this purpose.
