#### STATEMENT OF REASONS

- Lincolnshire County Council recently received a request to review the parking situation in the vicinity of Church Street, The Avenue and St Guthlac Avenue
- Following investigations at the above-mentioned locations the following points were noted:
  - The existing No Waiting at Any Time 8 am to 6pm restrictions on Church Street and The Avenue were no longer appropriate
  - A lack of any restrictions on St Guthlac Avenue were leading to inconsiderate and dangerous parking causing safety concerns for all road users.
- It is proposed to introduce No Waiting at Any Time on St Guthlac Avenue with the junction of Church Street and to replace the No Waiting at Any Time 8am to 6pm on Church Street and The Avenue with No waiting at Any Time
- These restrictions will facilitate traffic flow and maintain good visibility and road safety for all users
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to prohibit waiting as set out on the Plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable, Market Deeping Town Council and South Kesteven
   District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies
