## **STATEMENT OF REASONS**

- Following investigations at the above-mentioned location it was found that there is an increased need for restrictions to improve visibility Greetwell Road, Lincoln.
- The proposals will prevent parked vehicles and ensure visibility and road safety for all users.
- The Bus Stop Clearway will provide a designated area for buses only to utilise, subsequently improving access.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to prohibit waiting as set out on the Plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable, City of Lincoln District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make an Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to:

Mandatory No stopping except local buses 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The bus stop clearway replaces the existing bus stop markings and will conform to the Regulations.

Prohibit waiting either side of the northern bus stop clearway, outside the access of 52 Greetwell Road and partially outside number 48.

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.
