

## **LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL'S RESPONSE TO CONSULTATION ON THE FOLLOWING DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL**

**Proposal: Construction of a part single storey, part two storey 19 bed Adult Acute Inpatient Mental Health unit with patient accommodation at ground floor including associated staff facilities, landscaping and parking**

**Location: Former Norton Lea Hospital, Corktree Crescent, Boston**

This report includes the Substantive response of the Local Highway and Lead Local Flood Authority to a planning consultation received under the Development Management Order and includes details of any planning conditions or informatives that should be attached in the event that permission is granted and any obligations to be secured by way of a S106 agreement.

### **General Information and Advice**

#### **Outline applications and contributions**

The anticipated number and type of dwellings and/or the floor space may be set by the developer at the time of application which is used to assess necessary mitigation. If not stated in the application, a policy compliant mix will be used. The number and type of dwellings used when assessing S106 planning obligations is set out on the first page of this response.

In the case of outline applications, once the unit mix/floor space is confirmed by reserved matters approval/discharge of condition a matrix (if appropriate) will be applied to establish any increase in contributions payable. A further increase in contributions may result if there is a reserved matters approval changing the unit mix/floor space.

Please note that although the Definitive Map and Statement proves the existence of any recorded rights of way, there may be further or higher rights that are not shown on this document that the County Council is not currently aware of. This would be especially relevant where the public has had informal access to the site or where there are references to routes across this in maps or other historic documents. As the County Council has

received no application to recognise further rights of way affecting the site, no more informed guidance can be offered at this stage.

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## **Highway and Lead Local Flood Authority Report**

**Substantive Response provided in accordance with article 22(5) of The Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (England) Order 2015:**

**Recommendation:**

**No objection.**

The proposed development is a Healthcare facility that is to be built on the site of a former, now demolished, Healthcare facility. The proposed facility is to utilise the same combined pedestrian and vehicle access that served the former facility for many years and is therefore considered to have been proven as safe and suitable for such use. The site is very close to the A16 and therefore has good connection to both the national and the local highway network. There are existing bus stops within close proximity to the Application Site and there are footways and cycleways on both sides of London Road.

The surface water drainage of the site is to be managed by discharge into an Internal Drainage Board watercourse that runs alongside the site's southern boundary.

In view of the above and having given due regard to the appropriate local and national planning policy guidance (in particular the National Planning Policy Framework), Lincolnshire County Council (as Highway Authority and Lead Local Flood Authority) has concluded that the proposed development would not be expected to have an unacceptable impact upon highway safety or a severe residual cumulative impact upon the local highway network or increase surface water flood risk and therefore does not wish to object to this planning application.
