ORDER 20

THE LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 3(2) Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

- This Order shall come into operation on
 as the Lincolnshire County Council (Spalding Various Roads) (Prohibition of Vehicles Except for Access) Order 20
- 2. Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter or proceed on any road or length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order between the hours of 10.00am to 4.00pm.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter or proceed on any road or length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order between the hours of 4.00pm to midnight and midnight to 10.00am.
- 4. Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter or proceed on any road or length of road specified in the Schedule, if the vehicle is:-
 - (a) for Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes;
 - (b) granted special written exemption by Lincolnshire County Council.

(c) a purpose built or specially adapted security vehicle which by distinctive external markings and/or trade signs may be easily identified as a security vehicle, operated by uniformed security personnel and which is being used for the purpose of delivery or collection of:

(i) bullion or

(ii) substantial quantities of money in the form of cash or

(iii)high value commodities

- (d) being used to gain access to off street garaging.
- (e) Other than a privately owned vehicle, any which is being used as an official vehicle for the purpose of a wedding or funeral at a Church or place of worship.
- 5. Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter or proceed on any road or length of road specified in the Schedule, if the vehicle is:-
 - being used for or in connection with the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to that length of road or where access cannot be obtained to premises on adjoining roads by any other public highway;
 - (b) in connection with the carrying out on, or on premises situated on or adjacent to, that length of road of any of the following operations, namely:
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road;

(iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or In land adjacent to that length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 of the Digital Economy Act 2017;

(c) in the service of a local authority, water undertaker or sewage undertaker in connection with work being carried out on, or on land adjacent to that length of road in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

- (d) being used for the provision of a local service as defined in section 2 of the Transport Act 2000.
- 6. The prohibition imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

- The current traffic regulation order in force at High Street and Ironmonger Street prohibits vehicular access between 10am and 4pm and contains a number of exemptions.
- The purpose of this consultation is to make your organisation aware of proposed amendments to those exemptions which will ensure that effective enforcement of the restrictions may be carried out. The aim of this proposal is to enhance the pedestrianised nature of these areas and improve pedestrian safety.
- It is proposed to restrict vehicular access between 10am and 4pm daily for all vehicles except those referred to below:
 - Emergency services vehicles
 - o Security/bullion vehicles
 - Vehicles displaying LCC waiver permit
- Before 10am and after 4pm vehicles involved in the following activities will be able to access the area:
 - o Deliveries/Loading and unloading
 - o Disabled parking
 - Operations relating to building, highway maintenance and utility works
- Whilst sufficient signage will be in place to allow the restrictions to be enforced, the order will also allow for a physical restriction such as bollards to be installed to enhance this between 10am and 4pm daily.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to restrict vehicular access.
- The Chief Constable, Stamford Town Council and South Kesteven District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.
