STATEMENT OF REASONS

- Following investigations at the above mentioned location it was found that during peak school drop off/pick up times there are vehicles parked/waiting on the advisory 'School Keep Clear' markings.
- Vehicles have regularly been observed parking inconsiderately resulting in difficulties for all road users and raising safety concerns.
- The introduction of a formal Traffic Regulation Order will discourage parking/waiting on the 'School Keep Clear' markings and enable civil parking enforcement officers to issue Penalty Charge Notices where appropriate.
- The proposals will facilitate traffic flow, ensure all accesses are kept clear and improve visibility and road safety for all users.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to prohibit waiting as set out on the Plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable and City of Lincoln Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Lincolnshire County Council propose to make an Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting as set out in the Schedule below: -

- Introduce No Waiting at Any Time along Laughton Way from Hampton House to 41 Laughton Way including at junctions of Gayton Close and Redbourne Drive.
- Introduce mandatory School Keep Clear Mon-Fri 8.45am-9.45am and 3pm-4pm at two school entrances.
- Introduce No Waiting at Any Time fronting the school between the two School Keep Clear restrictions

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus.
