#### **STATEMENT OF REASONS**

- Investigations have shown parking opposite the school entrance on Kitty Briggs Lane is causing visibility and safety concerns for school buses and residents.
- To enable a coherent approach the loading restrictions are proposed on Denton Avenue / Rosemary Crescent, so that all no waiting at any time restrictions in the area also have the same loading constraints.
- The proposals will remove obstruction of the highway by parked vehicles, facilitate traffic flow, ensure all accesses are kept clear and improve visibility and road safety for all users.
- Therefore, in accordance with the County Council's Policy, it is proposed to prohibit waiting and loading as set out on the Plans to the Order.
- The Chief Constable, Grantham Town Council and South Kesteven District Council have been consulted, along with other local groups/companies.
