General Information and Advice

Having given due regard to the appropriate local and national planning policy guidance (in particular the National Planning Policy Framework), Lincolnshire County Council (as Highway Authority and Lead Local Flood Authority) has concluded that the proposed development would not be expected to have an unacceptable impact upon highway safety or a severe residual cumulative impact upon the local highway network or increase surface water flood risk and therefore does not wish to object to this planning application.

Introduction/Site Location

This is an agricultural site with agri-environment stock grazing and arable land use in equal amount. The proposal is to use this site to work with drainage authorities and farmers in exploring working wetland landscapes and crops such as reeds, water farming, specialist grazing which are environmentally sustainable, support wildlife.

Existing Conditions

This is low fenland area, going southwest to northeast with low pockets of ground. Drains are present and provide a boundary around most of the site.

Highway safety/Highway capacity

Existing access is via a 1km farm track off the A151 Bourne to Spalding Road at the side of the property at 40 Spalding Rd. PE10 OAU. BSIDB and the Environment Agency (EA) maintain access to the site via the Bourne Eau Pumping Station.

No new access works are proposed currently. The site is not open to the public, although small numbers of visitors accompanied by a Warden or LWT employee/volunteer.

Flood Risk and Drainage

Expanding water management works to engage with the wider catchment issues and opportunities such as water resource, quality, flood risk management.

This will include inlet Sluice and pipes, solar pump and reedbed polishing.
