30 YEARS OF LINCS & NOTTS AIR AMBULANCE

1994

Six-year-old Shaun's heart stopped beating three times. LNAA ensured he reached a specialist hospital in record time.

"If they hadn't flown me to Queen's Medical Centre I probably would have died."



2002

Chris was an up-and-coming championship racer, competing in his first full season. He was racing at Cadwell Park when his world went black and he crashed at 120mph.

"The Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance was the link that enabled my life to be saved."



2016

John stopped on the hard shoulder near Blyth to investigate an issue with his lorry. Unfortunately, whilst walking around the vehicle, he was struck by another truck.

"Without the intervention of the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance, I would have either died or suffered worse injuries."

James had been harvesting potatoes on a farm near Retford, Nottinghamshire when his arm got caught on the machine.

"The quick delivery to hospital saved my life. Nothing else compares to what LNAA does."

Whilst travelling slowly on his bike, Neil decided not to put his helmet on. He hit a speed ramp, fell backwards and the bike landed on top of him.

"The speed of the helicopter makes a huge difference to the patient's recovery."

When Andrew suffered a cardiac arrest at Grantham Swimming Pool, the LNAA team were by his side, continuing CPR started by two spectators.

"We will forever be grateful for what everyone did that day."



May Mission Breakdown


In May 2024, we responded to 166 missions.

We provided life-saving emergency anaesthetics to 8 patients, and for three patients, we administered a total of five units of blood products.



Additionally, our critical care cars played a crucial role, responding to 97 incidents. Overall, we transported 64 patients to 11 different hospitals, ensuring they received the specialised care they needed.

The most prevalent emergency type we responded to were medical emergencies with 58 call-outs.
